Adani, Embraer Tie Up for Making Aircraft in India

New Delhi: The Adani Group has tied up with Brazilian aerospace major Embraer to build an assembly line for regional commercial aircraft in India.

While the final decision on setting up the facility will depend on getting a sizeable order from an airline, the partnership is the first concrete step towards India becoming self-reliant in aerospace manufacturing.

Despite being one of the major markets for aircraft manufacturers, Airbus and Boeing have not shown interest in setting up assembly lines in the country and instead concentrated on increasing sourcing from local players.

Embraer, the third-largest civilian aircraft manufacturer behind Boeing and Airbus, makes the Embraer Regional Jet and E-Jet families of narrow-body, short- to medium-range passenger aircraft. It also makes private jets, defence aircraft and agricultural planes.

"Together, we will establish a regional aircraft manufacturing facility in India and a one-of-a-kind aviation ecosystem, a project that will redefine the future of aviation in our country," Adani Group Director Jeet Adani told reporters here.

Embraer will look to produce smaller aircraft suited for the country's regional connectivity.

Earlier Jeet Adani told ET that his company was interested in setting up an assembly line provided it got a customer in the country.

Embraer's biggest plane, the E2, is smaller than the Boeing 737 and Airbus A320 but Meijer is of the view that this is an opportunity. That's because Indian carriers fly to many small, regional destinations.

"We see a big future in India and we believe stars are aligning for making in India," Meijer said.

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Taking Up Vacant Space

INDIA CAN BE EXPORT HUB FOR RENAULT ICE VEHICLES TO EUROPE: CEO

'India-EU Deal may also be Good for Indian Car Cos'

New Delhi: India's trade deal with the EU will unlock opportunities for carmakers in the country to grow exports to the 27-nation bloc, said Fabrice Cambolive, global CEO for the Renault Brand.

He said while the free trade agreement (FTA) would inject new automotive technologies into the Indian market, it is also crucial to ascertain whether Europe has the capacity to absorb India-made cars without tariffs.

"What I see when I'm looking at the level of cars you are able to produce here in India—price, technology—many many cars could also find a place in Europe," said Cambolive. "And if it's the case—because we'll know the details in the coming days—it can be really a joining (of) market which will be very interesting for us in terms of automotive to play on both legs."

While India has agreed to reduce basic customs duties on

vehicles to 35% and thereafter to 10%, from the current 70%, EU has said it will eliminate tariffs completely on vehicles imported from India, increasing export competitiveness of Made-in-India cars. Timelines for implementation of this phased duty structure is yet to be notified by the two regions. The FTA is slated to be implemented only in 2027/2028, after detailed technical/legal review and ratification by both parties.

Cambolive, however, said it does open up possibilities of the French carmaker leveraging its manufacturing base in the country to ship petrol and diesel vehicles back to Europe, going forward.

"It's (using India as a production hub for Internal Combustion Engine (ICE) vehicles for Europe) a possibility," he said. "In Europe now, the BEV (battery electric vehicle) mar-

ket is at 17% versus 4.5% in India. When you are at 17%, there is no way back," he said, adding the company is likely to utilise its capacities in Europe to boost sales of strong hybrid vehicles and BEVs.

Social Security Pacts with 13 EU Nations on Fast Track

New Delhi: The India-European Union free trade agreement (FTA) will fast-track social security agreements with 13 of the 27 nations in the bloc over the next five years, a move that is expected to benefit Indian professionals working in these countries. India already has a social security agreement with 14 EU member states as these agreements are done bilaterally between nations.

As part of the FTA, announced on Tuesday, India and the EU have agreed on a constructive framework to enable social security agreements in five years with all EU member states. Commerce secretary Rakesh Agarwal said social security agreements are in the remit of the member states and they do not fall under limits of the European Commission. "This is the first FTA where in we have brought in social



security because this is an important need of India, and we have linked it to some of our forward most-favoured nation (MFN) commitments under services," he said. "For first five years, these commitments will stand along with the nudge to the member states to move towards social security agreements though these agreements naturally have to be done bilaterally."

India has social security agreements with numerous countries, including Australia, Austria, Belgium, Canada, Czech Republic, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Japan, South Korea, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Sweden, Switzerland and Brazil, to help workers avoid double contributions and enable benefit portability. —Our Bureau
